**CALL FOR MASTER’S THESES IN RELIGIOUS DIVERSITY AND
MIGRATION**

The COST Action “Connecting Theory and Practical Issues of Migration and Religious Diversity” (COREnet) offers an exciting opportunity to submit master’s theses for a chance to be selected to participate in person at the 38th Biennial ISSR conference “Religion, Migration, and Conflicts in Polarized Societies” conference in Kaunas, Lithuania (June 30 – July 4, 2025, at Vytautas Magnus University). Travel funds will be available for the winner (the author of the best master thesis).

What type of master’s theses can apply?

All master’s theses written between 2021 and 2025, from the European countries, in the field of practice-based research on religious diversity and migration, broadly defined, are eligible. Master theses should be single-authored. There are no limitations regarding the length or grade of the thesis. A precondition is, however, that the author has submitted the thesis. If the master’s thesis has not yet been defended or graded, the applicant must provide documentation confirming its submission.

Should the master’s thesis be in English?

It is the ambition of the COREnet master’s thesis award to allow for theses in any language, but an abstract (max. one page) must be in English. We will try to recruit evaluators in all languages and evaluate theses in any language.

Who can apply?

All authors of master’s theses, or their supervisors, can apply. We particularly encourage master’s theses supervisors to motivate their master’s students to apply, or to submit the application on behalf of their students (if both parties agree). We understand that it is not always easy for master’s theses authors.

Timetable and process

The deadline for submitting the master's thesis is **January 31, 2025**. The master's thesis should be sent to corenet@vdu.lt with an English abstract (max one page) and the required documentation (applicable to those who have not defended/ received the grade for their master's thesis yet). The email should be marked with "COREnet Master's Thesis Contest".

At the beginning of February 2025, the evaluation committee, consisting of experts from different disciplines and (language) contexts, will start the evaluation. The committee will prepare a ranked list of the submitted theses and suggest an award winner by April 15th, 2025. COREnet will officially announce the winner in April 2025.

Evaluation Process

All master's theses will read by at least two evaluators who will give them a score between 1 (weak) and 5 (excellent) with regard to the following five criteria.

Criteria	Weight
Relevance of the thesis for the call	20 %
Clarity and consistency of the methods	20 %
Clarity and consistency of the argumentation	20 %
Relevance of the research and the results for the practice	20 %
Innovation/potential for innovation	20 %

The best three master's theses will be read by the whole evaluation team and ranked after this.
